
WHAT AND HOW WE TEACH?




PARENTAL OBLIGATIONS

Ziyara (Commonly referred to as, Ziyarat) is a pilgrimage to sites associated with the Prophet (pbuh) and his progeny, their companions and Islamic scholars. Ziyara can also refer to sending salutations to them from afar



Q KIDS

A variety of resources which I help children explore the wonders of Divinity and learn about Islam in a fun way.

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A TYPICAL Q SCHOOL DAY

Assembly: Starts with knowing the current Islamic day and times of salaa on the day, followed by a short discussion on current affairs and relevant calendar event commemorated during that week.


Qur'an Recitation: Classes are ability based.

Salaa: Zhuhrayn Salaa is a lesson on its own where salaa is prayed in jamaa'a for the older classes and as a class for the younger ones.








- Focus points are used to 'hook' the story.














QUR'AN CITY


The Qur'an encourages investment in real estate in Janna. It is with this encouragement that we decided to teach the structure of the Qur'an through building a city with bricks.

The word 'sur' means an enclosure also referring to the defensive wall built around a city.









QUR'AN CITY

With 114 buildings, Qur'an City is divided into 19 suburbs which circle Muhammad City Centre. The placement of the buildings in the suburbs are based on their and/or the opening verse of each chapter (sura).

Each building can be distinguished as Makki or Madani through their roof tops. Yellow for Makki and Green for Madani. The chapters revealed in Makka are known as Makki, and the chapters revealed in Madina known as Madani. There are 86 Makkan chapters and 28 Madani chapters.

The distinction between them can be described as the journey from the why? (the nature of belief) to the how? (the manifestation of belief into a way of life which leads towards one's personal best). The presence of Makkan verses in Madani and vice versa shows that why and how are interwoven throughout the journey of life.









QUR'AN CITY BUILDINGS

The heights of the buildings represent the number of ayaat of the suwer and can be distinguished as Makki or Madani through their roof tops (Yellow for Makki and Green for Madani). There are 86 Makki buildings and 28 Madani buildings.
