Humaza means to destroy another's character and integrity by words or deeds through gossip for personal gain - to present oneself in a better light.



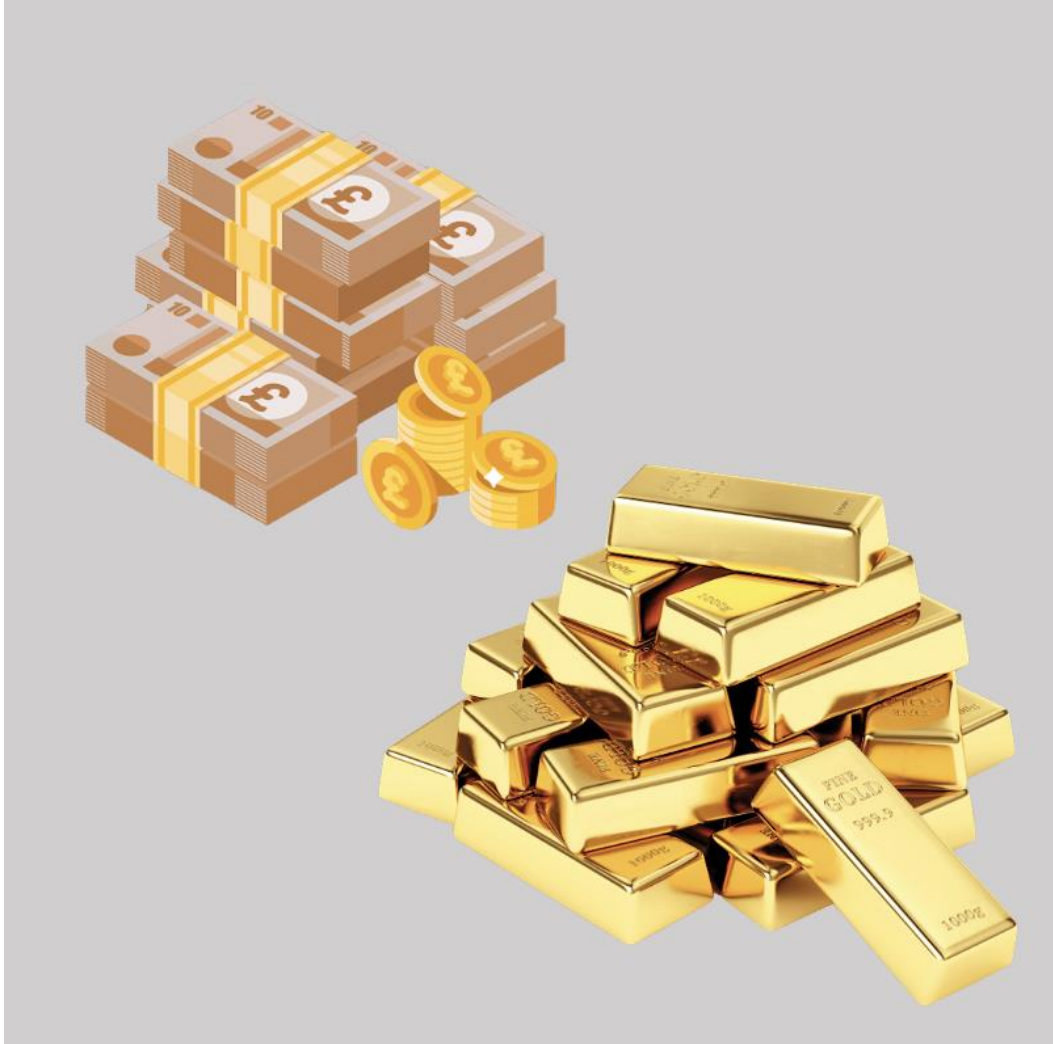
# BENEFITS OF RECITATION
