








DENIED ACCESS






EQUALITY OF OPPORTUNITY IN EDUCATION



The number of girls who are currently out of education are more than number of boys.




















WHO IS MALALA?



She is known for her education and women's rights activist in the Swat Valley, Pakistan, where the Taliban had at times banned girls from attending school.

In early 2009, at the age of 11-12, Malala wrote a blog under a pseudonym (Gul Makai) for the BBC detailing her life under Taliban rule, their attempts to take control of the valley and her views on promoting education for girls.

Why did Malala write a blog under a pseudonym?









MALALA - EARLY LIFE



Malala was educated in large part by her father, Ziauddin Yousafzai. Malala started speaking about education rights when she was 11 years old!

Her father took her to Peshawar to speak at the local press club. "How dare the Taliban take away my basic right to education?" Malala's speech appeared in newspapers and television channels throughout the region.

COURAGE AND DETERMINATION



Despite the dangers that lay ahead, Malala continued going to school, she believed that the Taliban were wrong in what they were doing, they had misunderstood the true message of Islam.

On 9th October 2012, on her way home from school, as Malala and her friends were talking about their day, their school bus came to a sudden halt...



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




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ON THE WAY TO RECOVERY....



While Malala was still recovering in hospital, The UN Special Envoy for Global Education, called for the 10th of November 2012 to become the first "Malala Day".








