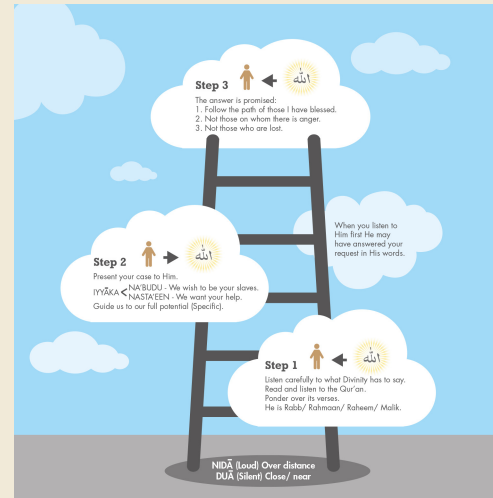

7 - REPLY FROM DIVINITY

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NARRATIVE



The primary meaning is THE OPENING and it opens the Qur'an on optimism and gratitude. Hamd is a combination of praise and gratitude.

It is recited in every cycle of salaa and also recited on occasions as diverse as funerals.

It is the first complete chapter to be revealed; a synthesis of the message of the Qur'an and its most important sura thus also given the title – Mother of the Book

It has a three-fold structure:

The first answers WHO IS GOD?

The middle verses deal with the RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN HUMAN BEINGS AND GOD.

The final section deals with the VARIOUS STATES OF THE HUMAN BEING.

SECTION 1 AYA 1

بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

In the name of Allah, the Most Merciful, the Most Compassionate.

Allah possesses two kinds of Mercy. General mercy like the warmth and light of the sun which shines on everyone (Rahmaan) and then His special ear marked mercy (Raheem) The more human beings expose themselves to it, the more they receive.



SECTION 1 AYA 2

الْحَمْدُ لِلَّهِ رَبِّ الْعَالَمِينَ

All praise and gratitude belong to Allah, the Rabb of the worlds

RABB - The Master and Manager of all affairs



SECTION 1 AYA 3

الرَّحْمَنُ الرَّحِيمُ

The Most Merciful , The Most Compassionate

SECTION 1 AYA 4

مَالِكِ يَوْمِ الدِّينِ

Owner (sole possessor) of the day of judgement

DEEN - Accurate accounts that are owed.



SECTION 2 AYA 5

إِيَّاكَ نَعْبُدُ وَإِيَّاكَ نَسْتَعِينُ

You alone do we serve and You alone do we ask for help

SECTION 2 AYA 6

إِهْدِنَا الصِّرَاطَ الْمُسْتَقِيمَ

Guide us on the straight (right) path

SIRAAT - A single smooth wide path that can be walked with ease and no confusion leading to Divinity

SECTION 3 AYA 7

صِرَاطَ الَّذِينَ أَنْعَمْتَ عَلَيْهِمْ
غَيْرِ الْمَغْضُوبِ عَلَيْهِمْ وَلَا الضَّالِّينَ

The path of those whom You have blessed, not of those on whom there is anger, nor those who have gone astray.
